	(5) Does lighting produce glare or shadows on stairs? If so,	
	replace with nonglare lights.	
	(6) Do handrails run continuously from top to bottom of flights of	

stairs?	
(7) Are handrails securely attached to wall?	
(8) Are step coverings in good condition? Stairs free of clutter?	
(9) Are guns kept in the house? Are trigger locks installed on all	
guns? Are guns stored unloaded? Is ammunition in a secure location?
